Learning to go through the formalities at customs. Showing your passport as proof of identity

8 The luggage search

Learning how to declare goods at customs. Speaking with a customs officer.

9 Hotel reservations

Learning some useful phrases for booking a hotel room

10 Staying in a hotel

Learning how to ask for precise information concerning the leisure activities available in a hotel. Learning how to ask for something and to express yourself politely. Paying the hotel bill.

11 A tour of the town

Learning some vocabulary concerning tourism. Learning how to ask questions about the different buildings you may encounter while sightseeing.

12 A tour of the castle

Learning a wide range of vocabulary concerning tourism, in particular the vocabulary used during a castle sightseeing tour.
